

### LIBRARY FACILITIES

The School is located one short block from the Osterhout Free Library, where ample library facilities are provided through the cooperation of the Library and Bucknell University. The Wyoming Historical and Geological Society, next door to the Library, is also open to students.

## PURPOSE

The purpose of the Bucknell University Junior College is to give students within commuting distance an opportunity to complete the first two years of a college course while living at home. The work of the Junior College is planned to make it possible for students to enter the junior year of whatever college or university they may choose, with the exception of engineering students, who should plan to transfer to a four-year college or university at the beginning of the sophomore year. Work may be elected to meet the requirements for admission to dental and other professional schools which admit students with two years of college preparation; also, the first two years of a four-year pre-medical or pre-legal course may be taken.

Bucknell University plans to offer the same opportunities for a broad, cultural education that are offered on the campus at Lewisburg. The work of the first two years in all courses except Engineering will be practically identical with that offered at the University, while the first year of the Engineering course will be the same. A well trained faculty will conduct the work, all of which will be under the direction of the Faculty and Administration of Bucknell University.

## REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION

1. All applicants for admission to the Bucknell University Junior College must be graduates of an approved four-year secondary school, or graduates of an approved senior (three-year) high school who have previously completed a three-year course in a standardized junior high school.

2. Applicants will be admitted to the Junior College on the basis of individual qualifications to do college work as indicated by such criteria as high school grades, rank in their graduating class, principal's rating, intelligence as measured by a good intelligence test, character, maturity, and other pertinent factors.
