

Ms. Patricia Young, chair-person of the National Coun-cil of Churches Crusade Against Hunger and an active advocate of the rights of the world's mior the rights of the world's mi-norities, was principal speaker at the annual luncheon meet-ing of the Wilkes Faculty Wom-en held recently at the Arena, Master Hosts Inn, Wilkes-Barre.

Ms. Young held the close attention of her audience with a vivid presentation of the cur-cent status of the human agenda. Her charge is that people who enjoy the benefits of a sophisticated society have a responsibility for the present state of a world in which life has become so perishable. The practice of reacting to crisis does not solve the problems of the human race. Societies with the numan race. Societies with the capability of effecting change must focus on global rather than national concerns since, whatever affects the people one nation, affects the people In all nations—"Vibrations are Universal."

Ms. Young decribes the "life-boat philosophy" of the affluent nations of the world. She said: "If we continue to consume, life support resources in our lion people are already existing at starvation level, what will be the impact of the projected population by the year 2009? A growing number of repressed, deprived, underfed people will sink the boat in their struggle for survival. Mankind will perish from the planet Earth. Mankind has the capability to achieve a balance between popu-lation growth and the resources essential to the maintenance of productive human life." The speaker concluded her remarks with a quote from W. H. Auden, "If we wish to live, we'd better try."


