**Brass-rubbing Demonstration
To Be Given Wednesday at 7:45**

Mrs. Lois Carpenter will present a demonstration of brass rubbing at a meeting of the Wilkes Faculty Women Wednesday at 7:45 p.m. in the Center for Performing Arts.

While stationed in England with her Air Force husband, Richard Carpenter, Lois discovered a hobby in an art form of historical value in Europe.

Brass rubbing grew out of the pre-tombstone era of the late 13th century when skilled craftsmen engraved flat sheets of brass to resemble the figures of prominent knights, merchants, bishops and royalty. Complete figures were inlaid and bolted to the top of a person's tomb, in the church floor or affixed to

the wall of the village church or cathedral.

The Carpenters and their two children now reside in Mountaintop. Captain Carpenter is with the A.F.R.O.T.C. Program at Wilkes College.

The site of Nanking, China, has been inhabited for 6,000 years.

Wilkes Faculty Women Finish Cookbook

Wilkes Faculty Women announce the completion of their new cookbook, "Recipes from Wilkes" copies of which are now available to the public. The 142-page book is a compilation of almost 350 choice recipes submitted by Wilkes personnel, including college faculty members and staff, faculty wives, and members of the secretarial staff. Some of the international students have also contributed recipes for favorite dishes of their homelands to add to the foreign flavor of toothsome delicacies from the kitchens of some of the Wilkes faculty members who come from other lands. With the many interesting and delectable recipes, some original, contributed in the American tradition, the cookbook is a delightful and well-balanced collection. Benefits from the sale go towards the club's Eleanor Coates Farley Scholarship fund.

The new cookbook is the second edition of "Recipes from Wilkes," first brought out in 1971 in quite different form. The first edition was the brain child of Ann (Mrs. Charles) Wilks, wife of a member of the mathematics faculty, who made the handsome covers and typed all the recipes, which were then multilithed by Mrs. Edith Gearhart in the Registrar's office and assembled by Ann, Ginny (Mrs. Richard) Orłowski, and a group of members and their husbands.

A year later many additional recipes were collected from new faculty women and a second edition attempted by Ann Wilks and club president, Betty Hopkins Moses. At almost completion point, in June 1972, their effort was overtaken by the Agnes flood, and partial salvage of master copies was the most that could be accomplished.

The current second edition is a professionally printed book with a photograph of the college on its cover colorful spiral binding, and pages that turn easily. Many new recipes were added this year by the committee and members. Chairman Carol (Mrs. Reed) Acheson solicited all women associated with Wilkes College and obtained a fine collection of gourmet and family type recipes to add to the original ones, making the second edition well over twice the size of the first, both in actual page size and in number of recipes. The lettering and art work were done by Betty Moses with illus-

trated pages as section dividers.

Other members of the cookbook committee are Mrs. Henry R. Casilli, Mrs. B. C. DeCosmo, Mrs. Roy N. Martin, Mrs. Chester N. Molley and Mrs. Harrie E. Caldwell.

The editor and chairman, Mrs. Acheson, wife of Dr. Reed Acheson of the biology department, is chairman of fund raising for the Faculty Women, and is responsible for the ambitious club project of raising \$400 annually, which is awarded to a worthy Wilkes woman student as the Eleanor Coates Farley Scholarship. Holder of this year's scholarship is Miss Bonita Metzger.

Other fund-raising projects include the sale of notepaper and other paper products, a decorations and household items, and the additional scheduling of a bake sale and a spring fashion show, soon to be announced. Copies of the cookbook are available at the Number Nine Shop, the College Bookstore, and from Mrs. Acheson and committee members.

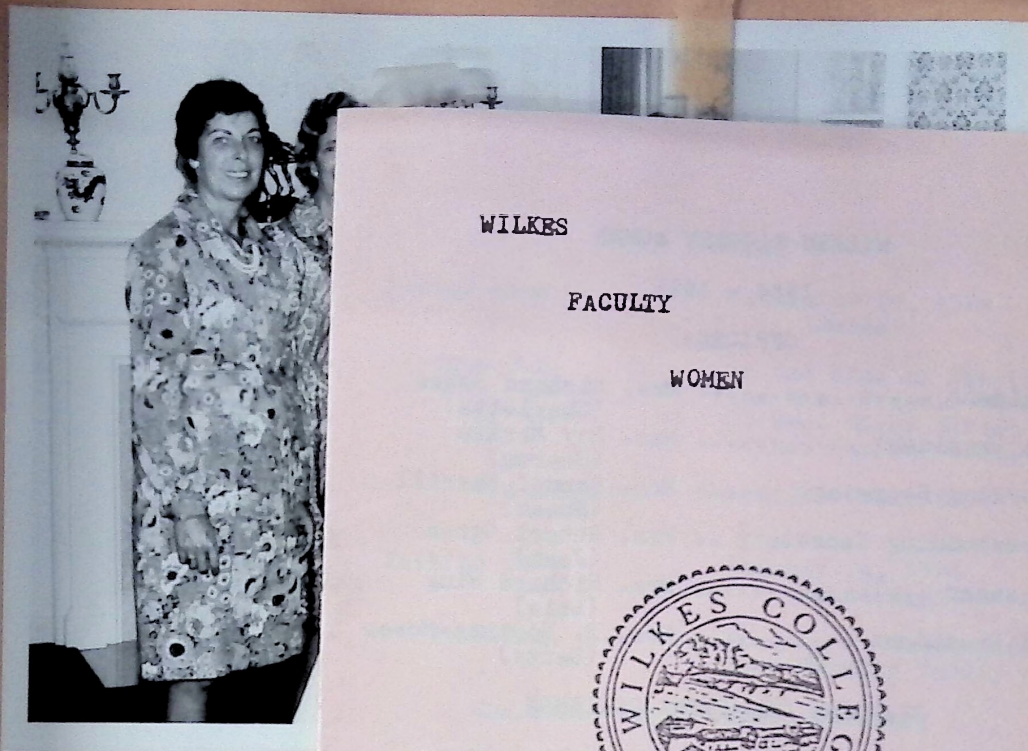

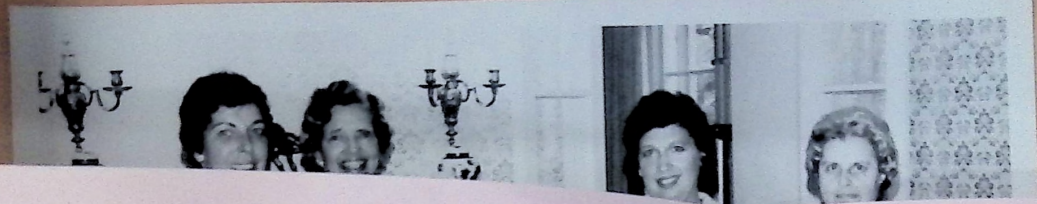

Ms. Patricia Young, chairperson of the National Council of Churches Crusade Against Hunger and an active advocate of the rights of the world's minorities, was principal speaker at the annual luncheon meeting of the Wilkes Faculty Women held recently at the Arena, Master Hosts Inn, Wilkes-Barre.

Ms. Young held the close attention of her audience with a vivid presentation of the current status of the human agenda. Her charge is that people who enjoy the benefits of a sophisticated society have a responsibility for the present state of a world in which life has become so perishable. The practice of reacting to crisis does not solve the problems of the human race. Societies with the capability of effecting change must focus on global rather than national concerns since, whatever affects the people of one nation, affects the people in all nations—"Vibrations are Universal."

Ms. Young decries the "life-boat philosophy" of the affluent nations of the world. She said: "If we continue to consume, life support resources in our present manner when 1½ billion people are already existing at starvation level, what will be the impact of the projected population by the year 2000? A growing number of repressed, deprived, underfed people will sink the boat in their struggle for survival. Mankind will perish from the planet Earth. Mankind has the capability to achieve a balance between population growth and the resources essential to the maintenance of productive human life." The speaker concluded her remarks with a quote from W. H. Auden, "If we wish to live, we'd better try."

Miss Casimir Tyburski, chairperson of the scholarship committee, presented this year's Eleanor Coates Farley Scholarship Award to Marsha Stratton. 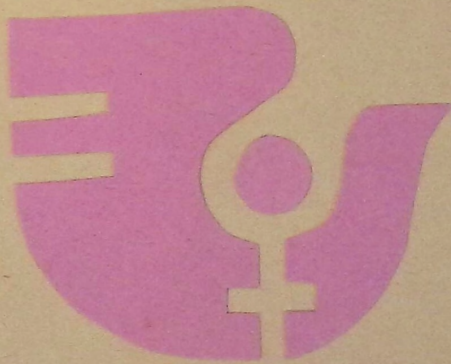


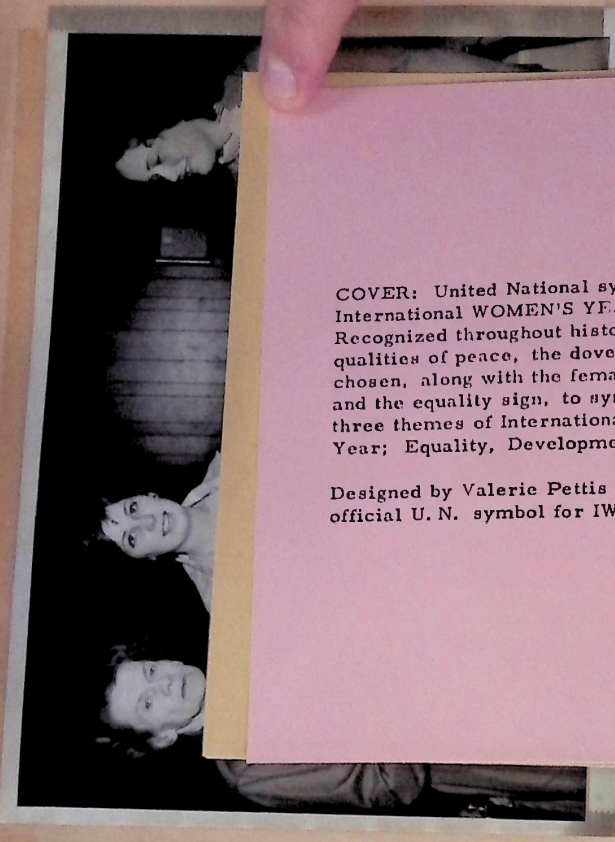

Mankind has the capacity to achieve a balance between population growth and the resources essential to the maintenance of productive life. The speaker concluded her remarks with a quote from W. H. Auden, "If we wish to live, we'd better try."

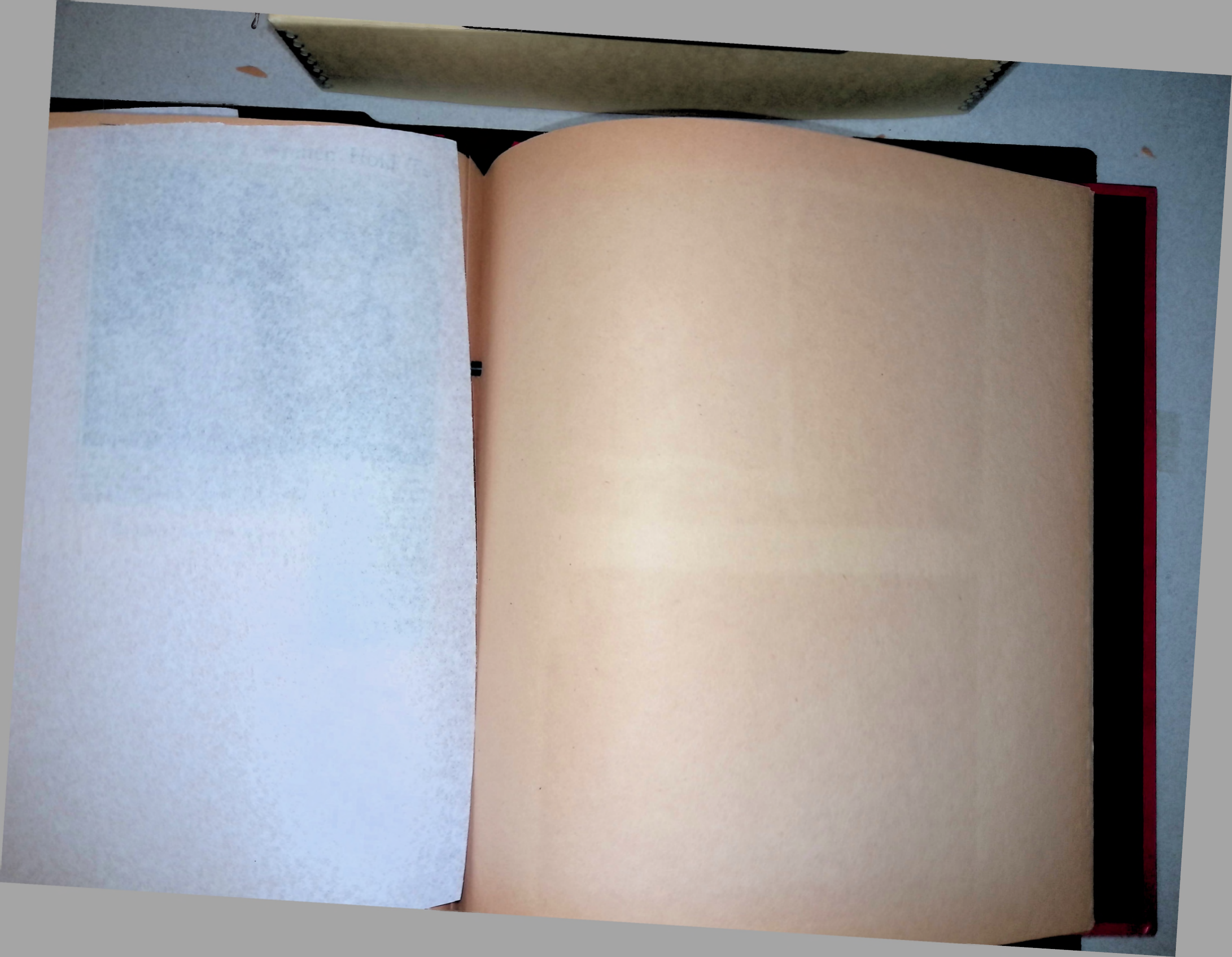
