#### HONORARY DEGREES

DANIEL KLEM, JR. .....DOCTOR OF SCIENCE Native of Kingston, 1968 graduate of Wilkes College, awarded the Bronze Star Medal for his military service in Vietnam, Ph.D. in Zoology from Southern Illinois University in 1979, Professor of Biology at Muhlenberg College, ornithologist and avian conservationist of world renown. Dr. Klem's research focus has been the encounter between birds and humans, particularly the daily encounter between birds and plate glass windows accounting for billons of bird deaths every year. His interest in birds as indicators of environmental health led him to be asked to study the ornithology of the Republic of Armenia, a project requiring extensive global cooperation. Two of the three volumes from this project have been recently published. His many research projects, most supported by external funding, actively involve his students, many of whom have gone on to distinguished scientific careers, the reward he most cherishes. His extensive field work is linked with his active support of several biological field stations, symbolized by his long standing leadership role with the Hawk Mountain Sanctuary in Kempton, Pennsylvania. A public environmental educator, he particularly seeks to help young people, including his three children, to discover their opportunities and their responsibilities to serve "this great country, our remarkable human species, and all living and non-living resources needed to sustain our Earth in good health."

CHARLES D. LEMMOND, JR. ..... DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS Born in Hazleton, raised in Forty Fort, graduate of Harvard College in 1952 after service in the U.S. Army of Occupation in Italy, law degree from the University of Pennsylvania Law School in 1955, clerked in the law offices of the Honorable Max Rosenn, practiced law for a quarter century in Wilkes-Barre, Assistant District Attorney in Luzerne County, appointed Judge of the Luzerne County Court of Common Pleas in charge of Orphans Court, elected to represent the 20th Senatorial District in the General Assembly in 1985, re-elected twice without opposition in either the Republican primary or the general election. Senator Lemmond enjoys a reputation of unblemished integrity and broad popularity. His three terms in the Senate have been associated with the cause of good government, election reform, governmental ethics, improving the judicial system including strengthening of the penal system, from court room to prison, securing the rights of abused children, and reforming workmen's compensation provisions to make Pennsylvania a more attractive state for business investment. Senator Lemmond was most responsible for the law requiring screening for hearing for newborns. He is Chair of the State Senate Government Committee, Vice Chair of the Judiciary Committee and Chair of the Board of the Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Authority (PHEAA). Father of four children, he regards this responsibility as well as the attendant satisfaction as his greatest.

RAPHAEL J. MUSTO ...... DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS Lifelong resident of Pittston Township, 1971 graduate of King's College after serving in the U.S. Army in Europe for two years, running the family grocery store and raising a family of four children, elected in 1971 to the Pennsylvania House of Representatives for the district represented by his father, elected for a partial term in the U.S. House of Representatives to represent the 11th Congressional District, elected in 1982 to the 14th Senatorial District whose constituents have re-elected him four times. Senator Musto is regarded as one of the most effective preservers of the natural environment in the Commonwealth. Most of the landmark legislation in Pennsylvania dealing with the environment — curbside recycling, clean air, clean water, land recycling, pollution control, acid mine drainage remediation, brownfields reclamation, low level waste management — Senator Musto has either sponsored or co-sponsored. He led the effort to establish the Environmental Education Program in 1993 to sensitize school students to their responsibilities for maintaining the environment, the first state-wide program of its kind in the nation. To his many environmental awards will be added this April recognition as "the Conservation Legislator of 2000" by the Pennsylvania Wildlife Federation. He is Democratic Chair of the Environmental Resources and Energy Committee and Vice Chair of the Joint Legislative Air, Water Pollution Control and Conservation Committee. Of top

importance to Senator Musto, as for his father before him, is direct service to his constituents on the most personal of matters. "Make them feel right," has remained

for the Senator both the best policy and the best politics.

# The University Mace and Presidential Chain of Office

The University Mace and the Presidential Chain of Office used in academic celebrations represent traditions dating to the sixteenth century. The mace symbolizes the authority of the university and the chain of office designates the presidential leadership of the academy.


The Wilkes University Mace and Presidential Chain of Office were gifts of local donors and were first used in 1970 at the inauguration of the second president of Wilkes. They were designed by Ottie Hill Chwalek '61 and executed by Kurt Matzdorf, a nationally recognized gold and silversmith from the State University of New York at New Paltz.

#### The University Mace

The sterling silver mace has a gilt knob at its base and a gilt circle at the top bearing the inscription "Wilkes College 1933." The bowl, rising above the neck of the mace, signifies Wilkes-Barre's role as a melting pot, forming a new and vigorous community of people from many different backgrounds. This theme is reiterated in the inscription of the University's motto "Unity Amidst Diversity" which surrounds the upper part of the bowl. The gilt flame symbolizes the enlightenment gained from higher education, while the piece of anthracite coal set in the center of the flame commemorates the origin of the University in a community known for its coal mining past.

#### The Presidential Chain of Office

The Presidential Chain of Office, created from sterling silver, has alternating bowls and gilt flames, repeating the motif of the mace. On the front of the four-foot chain hangs a gilt seal of Wilkes which is suspended from a cluster of oak leaves with acorns, suggesting the strength and sturdiness of future generations. On the back of the Presidential Chain of Office is a silver portrait of Dr. Eugene S. Farley, the first President of Wilkes. Dr. Farley's portrait is surrounded by gilt oak leaves commemorating his strong leadership of the emerging institution.
