JON CARSMAN

After graduating from Wilkes in 1966, Jon Carsman went on to take a master's of art education from New York University. Currently a painter and a printmaker, he lives and works in New York City.

Realistic in subject matter, Carsman's work is expressionistic in color and brushstroke. He works in acrylics on canvas and in watercolor to produce highlycolored, forceful images.

Carsman is represented in numerous public and private collections. Among the former are: the Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York; the Cleveland Museum of Art; and the Hirshhorn Museum and Sculpture Garden, Washington, D.C.

A selection of his one-man exhibitions include those held at: the Everson Museum, Syracuse, New York; Images Gallery, Toledo, Ohio; the Everhart Museum, Scranton; and the DeGraaf-Forsythe Gallery (Ann Arbor and Chicago).

In addition, his work has been represented in numerous group shows including: **Painting and Sculpture Today**, The Indianapolis Museum of Art (1976); **American Realism**, College of William and Mary, Williamsburg, Virginia (1977); **Collector's Choice**, Mississippi Museum of Art, Jackson (1979); and **Hassam and**

MARK COHEN

A 1965 graduate of Wilkes College, Mark Cohen has since made an impact on contemporary art photography. An innovator and a classicist at once, Cohen has influenced many other photographers.

The recipient of this year's Pennsylvania Governor's Award for Excellence in Photography, Cohen also has been twice awarded a Guggenheim Fellowship, and in 1975 he received a National Endowment for the Arts Fellowship.

Cohen has had one-man exhibitions at The Museum of Modern Art (1973); Castelli Graphics, New York (1977); The Corcoran Gallery of Art, Washington, D.C. (1981); and recently, Marlborough Gallery, New York.

Selected group exhibitions include: Photography in America, Whitney Museum of Art (1974); 10 Photographes Contemporains, Galerie Zabriskie, Paris (1977); Mirrors and Windows: American Photography Since 1969, The Museum of Modern Art (1978); Twenty American Artists, San Francisco Museum of Modern Art (1980); Counterparts: Form and Emotion in Photographs, The Metropolitan Museum of Art (1982); and FLASH, University of Hartford (1982). Most of Cohen's photographs are taken in the Wilkes-Barre area; he has a studio at 32 West South Street.

STEVE POLESKIE

Steve Poleskie, a 1959 graduate of Wilkes, teaches art at Cornell University in Ithaca, New York. He has traveled extensively, lecturing, exhibiting and performing. He is represented in collections including: the Museum of Modern Art; the Metropolitan Museum of Art; the Whitney Museum of American Art; the Walker Art Center, Minneapolis; and the Herbert F. Johnson Museum, Ithaca.

"The works in this show are preparatory sketches for aerobatic sky art pieces I executed at the State University of New York, Brockport and Purchase campuses.


"Prior to doing a sky art piece I fly over the site and photograph it. I am looking at its aesthetic potential as well as for possible hazards to the aircraft operation.

"I then return to the studio and make dozens of sketches for possible pieces. I must take into consideration such things as the wind, the position of the sun in relation to where the main body of spectators will be and a safe landing area should something go wrong with the airplane. Of these sketches only four or six may be actually executed and even these may be modified on the spot to suit the prevailing conditions. "The aircraft trails smoke to aid in the tracking. The pieces are never seen as a whole but only as a process of creation for as soon as a line is put down in smoke it is erased by the wind and remains only in one's memory."


