THEODORE ENGEL

Professor Ted Engel, a native of Florida, joined the Wilkes College Faculty in 1966. Prior to coming to Wilkes he completed his BBA in Economics and Business from the University of Miami, his MA in Economics from the University of Miami, and had served in the United States Army.

He assumed a variety of leadership roles including, but certainly not limited to: Dean, School of Business, Society and Public Policy; Chair, Commerce and Finance Department; Founding Commissioner of the international Association of Collegiate Business Schools and Programs (ACBSP); and member and chair of too many school and university committees to enumerate.

In addition to his unquestioned commitment to Wilkes and to his students, he found time to serve the community as a member of the Board of Directors of the Wilkes-Barre Chamber of Commerce; an advisor to the Mayor of Wilkes-Barr; an expert witness for the US House Banking Subcommittee, and an investment advisor to numerous clients. Ted also worked as a consultant to many companies and banks.

Ted is survived by his wife, Elaine Engel.

RICHARD FULLER

The Department of Integrative Media and Art, when thinking of Professor Richard Fuller and discussing names for the tribute award, used words like precision, perfection, dedication, professionalism, and effort; they settled on excellent. After ten years in the advertising industry in New York City, Dick came to Wilkes in 1969 and remained until his retirement in the spring of 2000. During that time he served as Chair of the Art Department and worked with hundreds of art students and art educators. He continued to teach, reflecting his high expectations to our students, in a part time capacity through the spring 2013 semester. Dick pushed each student to do their best, giving direction until there were no more changes to make. He was also an accomplished artist; inspired by his time in Kyoto, Japan, his specialty was in the creation of many beautiful art pieces using the techniques of Batik and Shibori.

Dick is survived by his wife, Cheryl Fuller.

UMID R. NEJIB

Dr. Umid Nejib was a native of Baghdad, Iraq. He earned a bachelor's degree in electrical engineering from the University of Baghdad, served in the Iraqi Air Force, and earned a master's and doctoral degree in electrical engineering from the Carnegie Institute of Technology. He joined the faculty of Wilkes College in 1965 and retired in May 2002.

While at Wilkes, Umid was responsible for developing the four-year engineering degree; the master's program in electrical engineering; and raised money through grants and donations for many of the labs in use today. One of the accomplishments of which he was most proud was his idea for, research on, and development of, the Doctor of Pharmacy degree. He served as the Chair of the Engineering Department, Dean of the School of Science and Engineering; Director of the Computer Center and temporary dean of the School of Pharmacy.

In addition to lecturing and presenting all over the world, Umid served on the board of the Luzerne County Interfaith Council; was President of the NEPA Arab-American Association; consulted with many large companies throughout the United States and held 3 U.S. patents. His dedication to Wilkes was unwavering, but he was most committed to his students.

He is survived by his wife, Barbara King.
