OUTSTANDING GRADUATE OF THE YEAR

JANE WILLIAMS SALWOSKI

This award is given by the alumni to the graduate considered by a special faculty committee to have made the strongest contribution to the life of the college.

DOBSON MEDAL IN ACCOUNTING

DONALD ROYAL LAW

Established in 1948 by Mr. W. F. Dobson, Wilkes-Barre accountant, this award is presented each year to the highest-ranking graduate in accounting.

WALL STREET JOURNAL AWARD DONALD ROYAL LAW

This award is granted by The Wall Street Journal to a graduate in commerce and finance for outstanding scholarship in his field of concentration.

PENNSYLVANIA INSTITUTE OF CERTIFIED PUBLIC ACCOUNTANTS AWARD

WILLIAM GEORGE NELSON

This new award is made to a graduating senior who has received high grades in accounting and demonstrated qualities of leadership in other activities.

MEDAL IN ENGINEERING

BERNARD PATRICK ZAPOTOWSKI

The oldest of these seven awards, this medal is given annually by the faculty of the Engineering Department to the student who has performed most creditably in the two-year engineering course.

CHEMISTRY AWARD

PRISCILLA MARY SWARTWOOD

This award, an outstanding recent book in the field, is offered by the Chemistry Department for the first time this year. It is presented to the graduate who has maintained the highest scholastic average throughout the four years of the chemistry course.

L. J. VAN LAEYS JOURNALISM MEDAL

CHARLES KLEIN GLOMAN, 3rd

Employees of the Wilkes-Barre Record established this award in December, 1949, as a Christmas gift to their vice-president, the late L. J. Van Laeys, who was then seriously ill. The fund that they presented to the College was used for the purchase of gold medals, one of which is given each year to a graduate who has demonstrated marked proficiency in journalism.
