

HONORARY DEGREE

In a life dedicated to preserving our physical landscape and conserving and protecting our natural resources, you are an example to us of what one truly talented and committed individual can do to safeguard our environment and cultural heritage for future generations.

A graduate of Harvard University and the University of Virginia Law School, you are regarded as our nation's most prominent environmental attorney. You currently serve as Clinical Professor of Law at Pace University, Chief Prosecuting Attorney for Riverkeeper, Senior Attorney for the Natural Resources Defense Council, and President of the Waterkeeper Alliance. With your considerable talents, commitment and experience you founded and serve as co-director of the Pace Environmental Litigation Clinic — hailed as a model for law clinics across our country.

As architect of the New York City Watershed Agreement, working on behalf of environmentalists and the City's watershed consumers, you crafted an acclaimed international model for stakeholder consensus negotiations and sustainable development. Your influence extends across the Americas, where you have negotiated treaties protecting indigenous tribes in Canada and Latin America from the loss of their native homelands.

You have written several books on the environment including the *New York Times* bestseller, <u>Crimes Against Nature</u>, and <u>The Riverkeepers</u>, co-authored with John Cronin. Your articles have appeared in such prominent publications as the *Atlantic Monthly*, *Wall Street Journal*, *Esquire*, *Vanity Fair*, *Rolling Stone*, and the *Village Voice*. Your most recent work titled, <u>St. Francis of Assisi: A Life of Joy</u>, written for a children's audience, reflects your deep and abiding devotion to St. Francis and the role of faith and spirituality in your life.

Named as one of *Time* Magazine's "Heroes for the Planet," you teach and lead by example. As we sit just hundreds of yards from the majestic Susquehanna River, your passion and energy provide us inspiration to achieve a new future for our River, one that returns the Susquehanna to its pristine past so that we might fulfill our obligation to preserve it for the future.

By the power vested in me by the Board of Trustees of Wilkes University, and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, I hereby confer upon you, **Robert F. Kennedy, Jr.**, the doctorate of laws, Honoris Causa, with all the rights and privileges thereto appertaining.

Academic Costume

The celebration of Commencement is surrounded by rich traditions. The established community of scholars — the Faculty — convene to recognize officially the newest group of proven scholars — the Graduates — and welcome them in fellowship. Graduates don the attire that for years has symbolized scholarly attainment.

During the Middle Ages those seeking an education traveled to European centers of learning. Centers of learning and universities were closely allied with the clerics of the time, and the scholars donned garb similar to that worn by the clergy. This evolved into the academic uniform, a long black gown, hood, and cap, which proved useful for studying in unheated and drafty buildings. The hood served simultaneously as a head covering, a repository for coins and alms and the forerunner of the modern day book bag. The hood was adorned with the colors of the university and designated the young scholar's school or university affiliation. By their distinctive clothing the students were set apart and distinguished from the citizens of the town; hence the origin of the phrase "town and gown."

American colleges and universities adopted the wearing of the traditional apparel in Colonial times, and a common code for academic apparel was established in the midnineteenth century.

The hood is the most distinctive feature of academic regalia. The inside of the hood is lined with the official colors of the institution; today you see Wilkes graduates wearing hoods lined with the blue and gold colors of the University. The velvet trim around the outside of the hood designates the degree or field of study of the graduates. The velvet colors worn by today's graduates signify the following:

Golden Yellow — Science

White — Arts, Letters, Humanities

Drab — Business Administration

Pink — Music

Brown — Fine Arts

Olive — Pharmacy

The style of the gown distinguishes graduates by the degree they have earned. Those earning the bachelor's degree wear a simple black gown with elongated pointed sleeves. Holders of the master's degree wear gowns with a longer, closed, square cut sleeve. The doctoral gown is trimmed with velvet stripes on the sleeves and panels of velvet on the front closure of the gown.

Some American universities have adopted doctoral gowns in their distinctive colors. You will notice the slate of Columbia, the red of Cornell, the burgundy of the University of Pennsylvania, the bright blue of the University of Michigan.

To have earned the privilege of wearing academic costume regalia signifies not only the completion of a program of studies, but entrance into the comradery of scholarship.

The University Mace and Presidential Chain of Office

The mace and the presidential chain of office used in academic celebrations represent traditions dating to the sixteenth century. The mace symbolizes the authority of the university and the chain of office designates the presidential leadership of the academy.

The Wilkes University mace and presidential chain of office were gifts of local donors and were first used in 1970 at the inauguration of the second president of Wilkes. They were designed by Ottie Hill Chwalek '61 and executed by Kurt Matzdorf, a nationally recognized gold and silversmith from the State University of New York at New Paltz.

The University Mace

The sterling silver mace has a gilt knob at its base and a gilt circle at the top bearing the inscription "Wilkes College 1933." The bowl, rising above the neck of the mace, signifies Wilkes-Barre's role as a melting pot, forming a new and vigorous community of people from many different backgrounds. This theme is reiterated in the inscription of the University's motto "Unity Amidst Diversity" which surrounds the upper part of the bowl. The gilt flame symbolizes the enlightenment gained from higher education, while the piece of anthracite coal set in the center of the flame commemorates the origin of the University in a community known for its coal mining past.

The Presidential Chain of Office

The Presidential Chain of Office, created from sterling silver, has alternating bowls and gilt flames, repeating the motif of the mace. On the front of the four-foot chain hangs a gilt seal of Wilkes which is suspended from a cluster of oak leaves with acorns, suggesting the strength and sturdiness of future generations. On the back of the Presidential Chain of Office is a silver portrait of Dr. Eugene S. Farley, the first President of Wilkes. Dr. Farley's portrait is surrounded by gilt oak leaves commemorating his strong leadership of the emerging institution.
