The ranger in charge took the Upward Bounders on a tour. At each stop the guide told us what happened in that room.

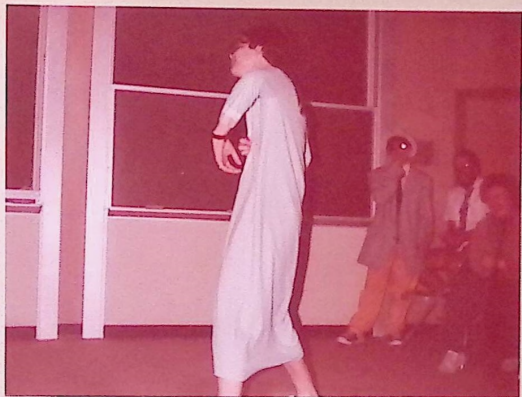

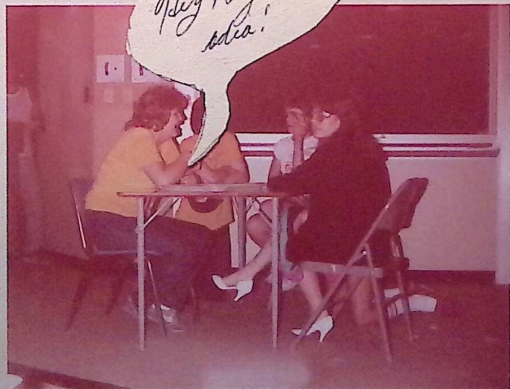
